we extend our hands by sharing food and the bread of life which is the word of God with the street children we also take them to one of the Nakuru field to play soccer. We normally have a total of around 20 street children both boys and girls. Sometimes former street children who are already in school are invited to advice the street children and give them hope that one day they will also get someone to educate them, they are also given a chance to give testimonies which challenge the street children by showing them that they too have a chance to be saved. Violence against girls as well as women remains a persistent problem that takes many forms, including sexual exploitation and abuse, rape, incest, prostitution, child pornography, trafficking, and harmful traditional practices such as female genital mutilation. Statistics reveal the urgent need for action Overall, girls' school attendance still lags severely behind that of boys. One of the major reasons why so many girls do not attend school is because of their workload, both within and outside the household. Daughters are often kept at home to help the family because the social and economic value of educating girls is not recognized. It is a little known fact that among the world's exploited child workers, girls outnumber boys. Without access to education, girls are denied the knowledge and skills needed to advance their status. By educating girls, societies stand to gain economically. In addition, educated mothers usually have smaller families, with healthier and better-educated children.



Our New Office






